**LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT

NIGER DELTA DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (LEGAL OFFICERS)(ENTITLEMENT TO PRACTICE AS BARRISTER AND SOLICITORS) ORDER 2003

Commencement : 15th August, 2003

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 2(3)(b) of the Legal Practitioners Act and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, CHIEF AKINLOLU OLUJINMI, S.A.N., Attorney-General of the Federation hereby make the following Order-

1.-(1) The legal practitioners mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, who are for the time being holding and exercising the functions of the office of legal officers of the Niger Delta Development Commission shall, for the duration of the tenure of the said offices, be entitled to practice as barristers and solicitors for the purposes of the offices.

Entitlement of legal officers of the Niger Delta Development Commission to practice.

(2) In this section, reference to the office of legal officers includes any re-designation of the offices as a consequence of promotion or upgrading of the holders thereof and reference to Niger Delta Development Commission means the Commission of that name established pursuant to the Niger Delta Development Commission Act.
